Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

Each year, on the third Monday of January, we honor the legacy and celebrate the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. King was a Baptist minister and activist who today continues to be remembered and valued as the most visible spokesperson in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. Martin Luther King, Jr. devoted his life to being a peaceful service leader who sought equality and human rights for African Americans, the economically disadvantaged and all victims of injustice.

Dr. King was an inspirational advocate of organized, nonviolent resistance. As we reflect on his life and his contributions to the American people, let us not forget that his protests were organized, nonviolent and successfully yielded positive outcomes. Some of the greatest remembrances that we have from the legacy of Dr. King are from the Montgomery Bus Boycott, the March on Washington and his most famous speech, "*I Have A Dream.*" He was also the youngest man to receive the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 and was voted Man of the Year by Time Magazine.

Although his life ended tragically, Dr. King's selfless works led to such developments as the Civil Rights Act and the Voting Rights Act. Today, others continue to carry on his legacy of promoting equality and human rights. As we reflect on the legacy and contributions of Dr. King, as leaders, let us not forget his famous quote: "*The time is always right to do what is right.*"
